MAGICAL TRAIN JOURNEYS IN SWITZERLAND

From vineyards to lakes to the most beautiful alpine valleys, travelers are offered the most breathtaking panoramas from train windows and wondrous insights into the country and its people. Traveling by train is the epitome of nostalgia, adventure and comfort. Discover a land full of extraordinary nature and people with Swiss trains all across the country.



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1. Aboard the Gotthard Panorama Express from Lake Lucerne to Ticino

A trip on the Gotthard Express is a journey full of adventures: over the alpine fortress, the Gotthard massif, to the palm-fringed Lago di Lugano. From picturesque Lake Lucerne, the Gotthard Panorama Express travels south through the historic old tunnel in the Gotthard massif. On its way to Lugano at the border to Italy, the panorama train offers impressive views of the sun-drenched villages and landscapes of Ticino.

2. On the Goldenpass Belle Époque from Montreaux to the Bernese Oberland

Immerse yourself in an era long gone. With the historic Belle Époque train from the Riviera of Lake Geneva to the impressive mountain world of the Bernese Oberland. This trip is all about water and wine. Along some of the most beautiful Swiss lakes, the train passes through arguably the most beautiful vineyards in Switzerland. And you don't even have to miss out on a boat ride on this very special trip.

3. With the Glacier Express from Zermatt to St. Moritz

The Glacier Express is called the "slowest express train in the world" and takes its guests on an unforgettable journey across the Swiss Alps. The journey takes eight hours from one exclusive winter venue to the other: The Zermatt - St. Moritz route leads from the foot of the Matterhorn over almost 300 bridges and 90 tunnels through the spectacular Rhine Gorge to the Engadine.

4. From the Three-Lakes Region through Lavaux to Geneva

From the land of the three lakes, the train travels south through idyllic Lavaux, Switzerland's best-known wine region, to the international metropolis of Geneva. This trip is all about water and wine. Along some of the most beautiful Swiss lakes, the train passes through arguably the most beautiful vineyards in Switzerland. And you don't even have to miss out on a boat ride on this very special trip.

5. On the Bernina Express from St. Moritz to Tirano

Looking out of the train window in Switzerland is like going to the movies. The Bernina Express in particular offers one of the most impressive alpine crossings on rails. The Bernina Express connects north and south and runs from St. Moritz to Tirano in Italy. Passing glaciers, mountains, and lakes, the train climbs to 2253 meters and is one of the most beautiful and spectacular Alpine crossings on rails.

6. On the Centovalli Express from Locarno to Domodossola

Discover the Italian part of Switzerland with the Centovalli Express. From Lake Maggiore through the scenic valley of the "hundred valleys". The special charm and way of life of Italian Switzerland is best discovered by train. Looking out of the window, one can hardly stop marvelling. So unique are nature, architecture, and people of the region.

7. With the Voralpen-Express from St. Gallen to Lucerne

From the rolling hills of Appenzellerland across Lake Zurich to vibrant Lucerne. There is a lot to discover for rail travellers in eastern Switzerland. A lake crossing on rails can perhaps only be found in Switzerland. The journey with the Voralpenexpress offers unique panoramas on its way from the east to central Switzerland and an insight into the historic architecture of the Swiss railroad pioneers.

8. From Lucerne via Interlaken to Jungfrauoch

From the turquoise Lake Lucerne up to the highest railroad station in Europe, the Jungfrauoch. The breathtaking view of Glaciers and the Alps crowns a captivating train journey. Starting the journey in picturesque Lucerne, the train passes numerous lakes and waterfalls on its way to Interlaken. From there, the highest cog train line "Jungfrau Railway" takes the travellers high up: past the north face of the Eiger up to the Jungfrauoch at 3545 meters.
